## **Sex Offender Registration Requirements**

Anyone who has been convicted or was under supervision for a register able sex offense (listed in Section 18-8304 Idaho Code) on/after 7/1/93 is required to register. Offenders convicted of similar offenses in another state that also meet the 7/1/93 qualification and who move to Idaho are required to register - Registration is basically for life. However, excluding violent sexual predators, recidivists and those considered as aggravated sex offenders, may petition the courts after 10 years for exemption from the registration. - Registration is accomplished yearly - in person at the local sheriff's office. In addition, - Offenders have 10 working days from entering a county for residence, or non-residents starting work/school in Idaho to register. - Offenders have 5 working days to notify the registry of an address or name change, a change in work/school status (non-residents), or moving to another state. - Violent Sexual Predators are designated as such by the Sexual Offender Classification Board. In addition to yearly registration, they also confirm their address quarterly by mail. Their pictures are published in the local newspaper 1x/week for 3 weeks upon yearly registration or address change. - Juvenile sex offenders register until the age of 21, but the prosecutor can petition the court for transfer to the adult registration requirement.

## **Sex Offender Special Conditions**

Yes, as deemed necessary by the supervising officer, sentencing court or parole commission.
