## **Sex Offender Registration Requirements**

Any convicted sex offender residing in this state shall, within 21 days of establishing residence or if a current resident, provide the sheriff of the parish in which they reside and the police chief, if applicable, their name, address, place of employment, the crime of which they were convicted, the date and place of said conviction, any aliases used, a description of every vehicle registered to them, including license plate number, social security number and a complete physical description. They must also give notice of the crime for which they were convicted, their name, address, physical description and a photograph or copy to at least one person in every residence or business within a one mile radius in a rural area and a three-tenths of a mile radius in an urban or suburban area of the address where they will reside. This same notice must be provided to the superintendent of the public school system of the parish in which they reside, the superintendent of any recreational parks/playgrounds within the parish, the leaser, landlord or owner of the residence or property where the offender will reside. They must give notice of the crime for which they were convicted, including name, address, physical description and photo to the official journal/newspaper of the parish in which they reside and said notice must be published on two separate days within the applicable time period. This information must also be provided to the State Police Registry and once each year, during the required period of registration, the offender shall verify their address with the Registry by returning the non-forwardable verification form. If the offender changes residence during the required time period, they must notify the Sheriff or Police Chief within ten days and are required to re-complete all other registration requirements within twenty-one days. A person required to register as a sex offender shall do so for a period of ten years after the date they were released from prison, placed on parole, supervised release or probation. A person determined to be a sexually violent predator, a person with a prior conviction for a sex offense and any person convicted of an aggravated sex offense must register for life.

## **Sex Offender Special Conditions**

- May be required to place a sign/notice in their yard/window
- May be subject to curfews and electronic monitoring
- May be ordered not to have any contact with minor children or juveniles
- All sex offenders under our supervision are required to attend sex offender treatment/counseling unless relieved of this condition by the Court or Parole Board.
